
Ashcroft/Cache Creek/Spences Bridge



Delta Literacy will be linking Family Literacy Week to Canada's 150th birthday. Gold River




The entire event is free to the public and the entire community is invited. Free coffee, pizza, and cake will be provided.


The goal is to have children aged 6 and up as well as adults and seniors with all kinds of backgrounds come together to share stories via a survey about how they experience the local community using the lens of Heart Mind Wellness (getting along with others, feeling calm and secure, etc.). The elders of the community will share how they experienced neighborhood/community when they were young and then will compare stories with other attendees. Each small group of about six people will be witnessed and recorded by "listeners" who are leaders such as municipal council members, indigenous community members, etc.







At the same time, StrongStart Centres are focusing on the importance of rhyme. Children love to play, and when they play with words, and the smaller sounds in words, they are developing an early literacy skill called phonological awareness. Recognizing when words rhyme and hearing the beginning sounds of words are parts of this skill set. Attendees at the centres will be playing rhyming games and activities, reading rhyming stories and singing lots of rhymes and songs.
